2. What do you mean by Judicial Review? Discuss the scope of judicial review in our constitution.
3. "Right to speech and expression is not an absolute right and the State can impose reasonable restriction on the exercise of these rights" — in the light of the above statement discuss the legal provision relating to sedition in India.
4. Discuss the constitutional provisions relating to reservation in public employment.
5. Doctrine of Equality ensured under Article 14 is a combination and culmination of the British and USA Models. Evaluate the Doctrine of reasonable classification with appropriate case laws.
6. Elaborate the meaning and content of the 'Right to life and Personal Liberty' under Article 21 of the Constitution of India. How far it includes right to have wholesome environment?

7. 'Constitutional Morality' is not a natural sentiment : it has to be cultivated'. Analyse this statement of Dr. Ambedkar in view of the working of the Indian Constitution till date.
