

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

1.4.3 UNIVERSITY OF GOUR BANGA GENERAL REPORT

Mission of the University

Gour Banga University has been established by the state Government of West Bengal in 2008 vide West Bengal Act XXVI of 2007 in the ancient land of "Gour Banga" as a multi-disciplinary, research led institute of global stature in order to provide the world-class education to students from all strands of society of three underdeveloped district of West Bengal i.e. Malda, South Dinajpur & North Dinajpur. The University aims to disseminate and advance knowledge and skill by providing instructional, research and extension of facilities for learning and promotion of:

- Innovations in education leading to restructuring of courses, new methods of teaching, training and learning, blended learning, continuing education and such other nodes and integrated and wholesome development of personality.
- Studies in various disciplines.
- Inter disciplinary studies\national intimation, secularism, social equity and engineering of international understanding and ethics.

Knowledge is the path to freedom. Political freedom; freedom from repression and coercion; freedom from want and hunger; freedom to seize opportunities and realize dreams; freedom of expression and personal development; indeed the full range of freedoms that characterize the human ideal, all are made possible, strengthened and deepened by the acquisition and application of knowledge. The University of Gour Banga is contributing and will continue to contribute to the process of creating and disseminating knowledge, cementing the path through which individuals and communities both within and outside India can realize and exercise these universal freedoms. The University is dedicated to the discovery, development; organization, preservation, dissemination, and application of knowledge in a wide range of fields with the purpose of expanding the scale and scope of human understanding and contributing to the betterment of the world. Committed to excellence in teaching, research and service, the University will serve the higher education needs of this Gour Banga and the world beyond.

The motto of the University as engraved on its emblem is "Charaiveti". It is an aphorism from the Aitareya Brahmana, which means "Go on". A powerful and potent word, in true Upanishadic style it exhorts us to move on and keep going. So also the University. From its very inception, it dedicated itself for the betterment of its student.

The University has a strong emphasis on leadership, responsibility and service to society, including a focus on the skills required to manage and lead public institutions, commercial enterprises and organizations in civil society. Its interdisciplinary focus is preparing its students not only to specialize in specific disciplinary areas but also to develop a broad-based learning foundation that incorporates a range of academic disciplines including the sciences and social sciences, humanities, and the education. Supporting, fostering and encouraging a range of research, scholarship and creative expression and the integration of teaching and research are vital aspects of the University's mission.

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1.4.5 ACADEMIC, ADMINISTRATIVE AND INFRASTRUCTURAL STATUS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF GOUR BANGA

- The University is situated at the outskirt of the English Bazar Municipality (Malda) on an area of land measuring 30.51 acres. All the colleges of the districts of North Dinajpur, South Dinajpur and Malda except Islampur College and Raiganj University College are under the perview of University of Gour Banga, Malda. Currently, there are 678 affiliated Colleges out of which 25 General Degree Colleges, providing B.A. /B.Sc. /B.Com. / B.C.A. courses, 41 Colleges for B.Ed. course and one college offering five years integrated B.A.L.L.B. course. The total intake capacity of the affiliated General Degree Colleges at present stands 1,20,000 approximately. The intake capacity of the B.Ed. Colleges at present stands 2742 (37 Self-financing B.Ed. Colleges have 3700 students and one Government sponsored B.Ed. college has 100 nos. of students and one Government B.Ed. College has 142 nos. of students capacity). Centralized On-Line Admission for B.Ed. Colleges of the University has been going on since 2010. The only one Law College is running with 250 nos. of students in five semesters.
- The University is running with 23 Post Graduate Departments at present. The subjects are *Arabic, Bengali, Botany, Chemistry, Commerce, Computer Science, Economics, Education, English, Geography, History, Law, Library and Information Science, Food and Nutrition, Mass Communication, Mathematics, Philosophy, Physics, Political Science, Physiology, Sanskrit, Sociology, and Zoology.* The Intake Capacity of the said departments stands more than 2500. All the PG Departments except Food and Nutrition and in Department of Journalism and Mass Communication, are running with Ph.D. programme.
- Presently there are two Affiliated General Degree Colleges offering PG Courses on self-financing basis. Malda College, Malda, offering PG courses on English, History and Bengali and Balurghat College, Dakshin Dinajpur, offering PG courses on Bengali, History and Sanskrit.
- Ten other job oriented Post Graduate Departments are planning to be introduced very soon. The departments are: *Tourism Management/Hospitality Management, Foreign Trade Practice, Floriculture, Agri-Business and Agro Processing Bio-Fertiliser & Bio-Pesticides, Communicative English & Soft Skill Development, Forestry & Wild Life Management, Hospital Management Para-Medical Technology & Services, Fisheries and Aquaculture, Multimedia & Web Development Technology, Animation Science.*
- Ten posts of Officers of the University have so far been sanctioned. Recruitment of 07 of such posts has already been done.
- Forty nos. of posts of non-teaching staff have so far been sanctioned for the University. 18 of such posts have so far been filled. Apart from them, 118 number of contractual staffs have also serving the University.
- Six Units of NSS, apart from doing various activities of the University, are engaged in performing various social works like arrangements for Blood Donation Camps and observations of the Independence Day, Republic Day, University Foundation Day, *Bhasha Dibas* etc.

It has tried to increase the Gross Enrollment Ratio by offering high quality teaching through blended mode. The University began by offering seven academic Post Graduate courses in 2008, with strength of 650 students and now successfully running with twenty three (23) Post Graduate (PG) courses with strength of 2000 students. The University is an academic institution; the primary function of Controller of Examinations

The Term-end Examinations of the University is likely to commence from 1st June and 1st December onwards in every year. Online link for submission of the examination form (TEE, & Practical Examinations) by the eligible students for June and December of every year Term-end Examination is also open along with the schedule and necessary instructions/guidelines thereof. The students may submit online examination form accordingly, by the instructions and guidelines provided. And generally the results publication date does not exceed 45 days from the last date of examinations of every Term-end Examinations of the University. The Officers of the Controller of Examination concerning the examination System of the University. Presently, the Department of Controller of Examinations is running with two Officers designated as Controller of Examinations and Deputy Controller of Examinations and fourteen numbers of Non-Teaching Staff are in substantive post. The Department of Controller of Examinations has published results in pursuance of CBCS curriculum from this year. The necessary works related to Ph. D. thesis are also performed by the Department of Controller of Examinations.

The aim of the development is to strive to make maximum number of Colleges of the jurisdiction of the University of Gour Banga to get maximum development in every aspect.





1.17 OFFICE OF THE LIBRAIAN

The University Library system was initiated in the year 2008 after the establishment of University of Gour Banga in the year 2008. The present library building was inaugurated in the year 2014. Now the Central Library is a two storied building.

Central Library was established in order to meet the academic and research need of the Teachers, Research Scholars, the Students and the other staff members. In a lively University campus, the Central Library serves as the hive of academic activities for students, scholars, staffs and faculty members in pursuit of excellence in their respective area of studies. Central Library provides books, journals as well as current information on various topics to fulfill the needs of the University Community. The Library also sets the goal of establishing a world class library by integrating information sources and services across disciplines in one umbrella by building a sound and comprehensive collection of both conventional and electronic resources on all branches of knowledge with a robust hi-tech infrastructural facilities and to redesign and revamp the systems and services in efficient, effective , and dynamic ways tailoring to meet the myriad information needs of students, research scholars, and faculty members of the university pin-pointedly, exhaustively and expeditiously anywhere on campus and beyond 24x7 hours for the sake of promoting academic excellence.

At present a separate floor is allotted for central library on the campus. It has an Advisory committee known as Library committee to look after the different functionaries of the Central Library as well as the departmental libraries.

1.19 OFFICE OF THE UNIVERSITY ENGINEER

Highlights of work in the Engineering department:

University of Gour Banga is affiliated under the West Bengal state Act XXVI of 2007 and recognized under section 12B and 2(f) of the UGC Act 1956. At present there are 14 nos. of Ad hoc contractual staff including 3 nos. of Junior Engineers are working in the Engineering department, University of Gour Banga. The total building plan of the University has divided into 2 phases (i.e. Phase-I and phase-II). The vetted estimated cost of the first phase is Rs. 83.81 cr. The first phase is going to be completed very soon with the financial grant received from the department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal from time to time. The Construction agency is Mackintosh Burn Ltd. The agency was engaged with proper procedure after getting approval from the department of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal. The highlights of the work are as follows.

Completed work (Phase-I):

Construction of 1) Boundary wall, 2) Main gate, 3) Administrative building, 4) Science building-1, 5) Electrical substation building, 6) University Guest house (old), 7) Internal roads, 8) Humanities building-1, 9) Central Library building, 10) Two wheeler & Car parking and allied Electrical works for above completed work.

Work in progress:

The WIP for the Construction of 1) Boys Hostel, 2) Girls Hostel, 3) Language building-1 and 4) New Guest house are going on at the campus of the University of Gour Banga at Malda.

OFFICE OF THE PROGRAMME CO-ORDINATIOR

2.1 NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

The National Service Scheme (NSS) is an Indian government-sponsored public service program conducted by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports of the Government of India. Popularly known as NSS, the scheme was launched in Gandhiji's Centenary year, 1969. Aimed at developing student's personality through community service, NSS is a voluntary association of young people in Colleges, Universities and at +2 level working for a campus-community linkage.

After independence the University Grants Commission, headed by S. Radhakrishnan, recommended the introduction of voluntary national service in academic institutions. This idea was again considered by the Central Advisory Board of Education (CABE) at its meeting in January, 1950; after examining the idea and the experiences of other countries in this field, the board recommended that students and teachers should devote time to voluntary manual work. In the draft first Five-Year Plan adopted by the government in 1952, the need for social and labour service by Indian students for one year was stressed. In 1958 Jawaharlal Nehru, in a letter to the chief ministers, considered the idea of social service as a prerequisite for graduation. He directed the Ministry of Education to formulate a suitable scheme for the introduction of national service into academic institutions.

Objectives:

The programme aims to inculcate social welfare in students, and to provide service to society without bias. NSS volunteers work to ensure that everyone who is needy gets help to enhance their standard of living and lead a life of dignity.

Major objective of this unit was to extend free service to the society considering some of the social issues which need to be addressed. Blood donation camp, different awareness programmes like Dengue awareness programme, traffic awareness, safety measures from river bank, tree plantation, cleaning programme etc.

3.3 DEPARTMENT OF BOTANY

The post graduate Department of Botany of the University of Gour Banga started its journey since January, 2012, with three faculty members and twenty students under a two-year-four-semester system. 

3.13 DEPARTMENT OF LAW

Taking into consideration the interest of local people in law and legal profession, the Gour Banga University resolved to establish a Law Department in the University to impart higher education in Law. Ultimately the Department of Law was established in 2016 with the appointment of two permanent Assistant Professors for the Department of Law with total intake of 20 students. The Department of Law is running two years LL.M. Course with CBCS Semester system. It has also opened Ph.D. programme in 2018. In March, 2018 three students have been admitted in the department for Ph.D. Course Work under the Ph.D. Programme. Becouse of the shortage of teaching faculty we cannot have specialization in LL.M., but the Department is looking forward to have more faculty in near future to start specialization on different stream of law. The moto of the Department is not only to impart advance legal education but also to fulfill the aspirations of local people of Malda. Till now

three students have qualified for th State Eligibility Test (SET), two have qualified for the National Eligibility Test (NET), and two students are pursuing their Ph.D. research work at IIT Kharagpur. Additionally, one student has secured a position in a government school, while several others are engaged in teaching as Assistant Professor in different Law Colleges.

3.17 DEPARTMENT OF PHILOSOPHY

The Department of Philosophy of the University of Gour Banga was established in 2012. The first day of starting classes of the department was 19th January, 2012. It was held in two rooms of Satya Chowdhury Stadium, Malda, rented by the university, along with two Assistant Professors: (1) Dr. Sukumar Chandra Roy, (joined on 14.01.2012) and (2) Purbayan Jha, (joined on 16.01.2012) and 70 students. So, the day was historically important for the department. In the next month i.e. in February, 2012, Dr. Ruchira Majumder joined the department as Associate Professor of Philosophy. With these three faculty members the department started its journey. After 1 semester year, the department had shifted to the main campus of the university in the *Dr. A. P. J Abdul Kalam Bijnan Bhavan and* finally to *Acharya Binoy Kumar Sarkar Kala Bhavan*, the Humanities Building of the university at the end of the year 2015. In the meantime, Dr. Jhadeswar Ghosh joined as Associate Professor in September, 2014. The department has also got two more faculty members by the fag end of 2015. Now the total strength of faculty members is five (5). The department offers a syllabus which stimulates the students to think critically on the philosophical problems. The key philosophical areas of study such as epistemology, logic, ethics, metaphysics, philosophy of language are studied both from Indian and Western perspectives, as well as modern Indian thinkers, aesthetics, continental philosophy, philosophy of mind and many more are there in the syllabus with updated developments in those areas. The faculty members are actively engaged in research works and eminent philosophers are invited as visiting faculties to deliver special lectures which enable the students to have sufficient exposure to the domain of knowledge.

The development and establishment of the Department, with its all mechanisms, is progressive and a plan wise, with a view to establish outstanding academic vibes at all the levels: teaching as well as research. This Department is equipped with some modern instruments for PG, M Phil and Ph D studies.

The Department has organized three seminars (two University level and one National level) funded by the University of Gour Banga, Malda, in the current session.
