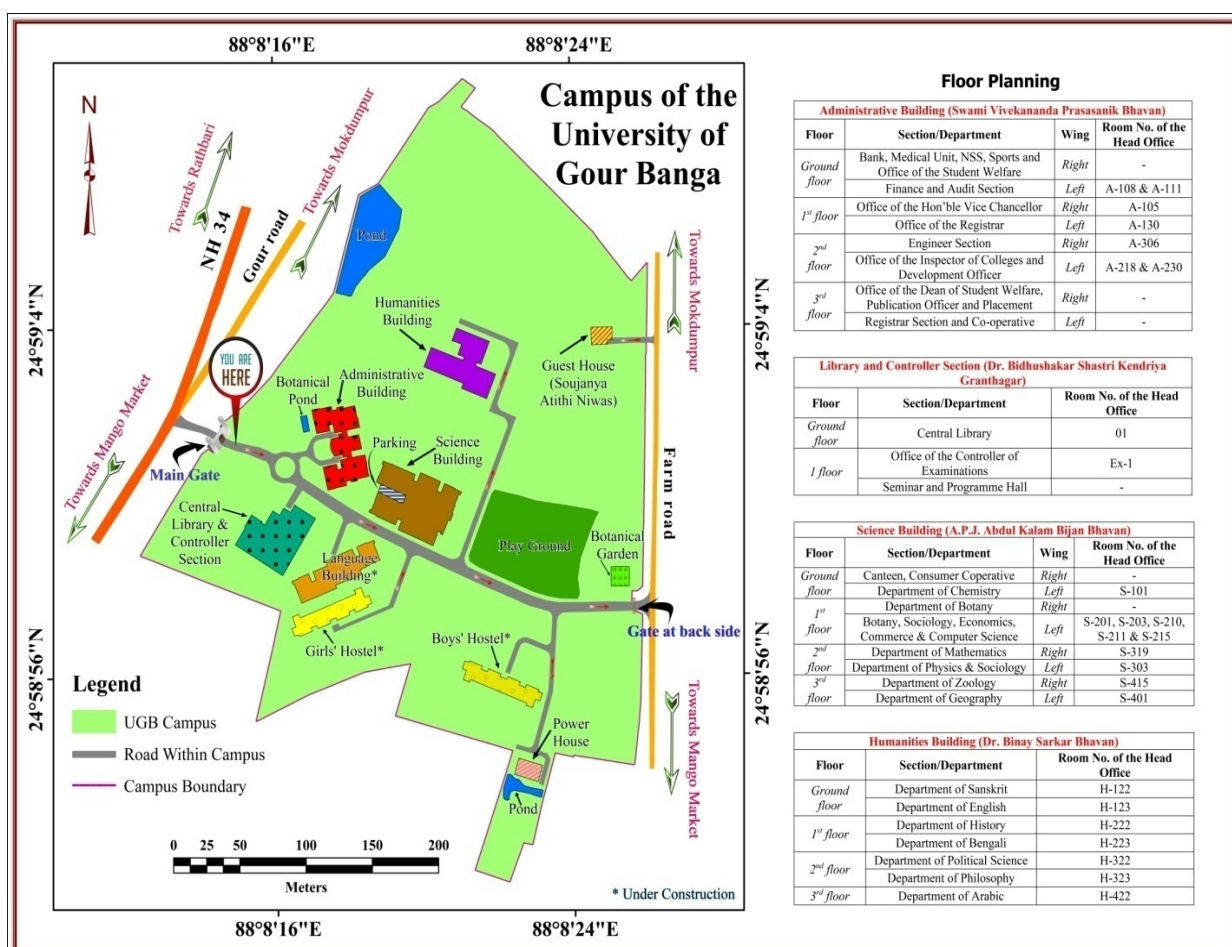

1.4.5 ACADEMIC, ADMINISTRATIVE AND INFRASTRUCTURAL

STATUS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF GOUR BANGA

- The University is situated at the outskirts of the English Bazar Municipality (Malda) on an area of land measuring 30.51 acres. All the colleges of the districts of North Dinajpur, South Dinajpur and Malda except Islampur College and Raiganj University College are under the purview of University of Gour Banga, Malda. Total Intake at PG level in the University is 1535. Currently, there are 25 degree Colleges and one Law college.
- The University is running with 23 Post Graduate Departments at present. The subjects are Arabic, Bengali, Botany, Chemistry, Commerce, Computer Science, Economics, Education, English, Geography, Food and Nutrition, History, Library and Information Science, Mathematics, Mass communication, Philosophy, Physics, Political Science, Physiology, Sanskrit, Sociology, and Zoology. The Intake Capacity of the said departments stands more than 1535. All the PG Departments are running with Ph.D.
- Presently there are two Affiliated General Degree Colleges offering PG Courses on self-financing basis. Malda College, Malda, offering PG courses on English, History and Bengali and Balurghat College, Dakshin Dinajpur, offering PG courses on Bengali, History and Sanskrit.
- Ten other job oriented Post Graduate Departments are planning to be introduced very soon. The departments are: Tourism Management/Hospitality Management, Foreign Trade Practice, Floriculture, Agri-Business and Agro Processing Bio-Fertiliser & Bio-Pesticides, Communicative English & Soft Skill Development, Forestry & Wild Life Management, Hospital Management Para-Medical Technology & Services, Fisheries and Aquaculture, Multimedia & Web Development Technology, Animation Science.
- Ten posts of Officers of the University have so far been sanctioned. Recruitment of 06 of such posts has already been done.
- Forty nos. of posts of non-teaching staff have so far been sanctioned for the University. 18 of such posts have so far been filled. Apart from them, 119 numbers of Ad hoc staffs have also serving the University.
- Total 10 NSS units apart from doing various activities of the University, are engaged in performing various social works like arrangements for Blood ...Donation Camps and observations of the Independence Day, Republic Day, University Foundation Day, Bhasha Dibas etc.

1.10 OFFICE OF THE FINANCE OFFICER

It is heartening that the University of Gour Banga is recognized under Sec 2(f) and 12B of the UGC Act 1956. The financial statement and all the financial transactions have not yet been audited by the Principal Accountant General (PAG), West Bengal till date. The audited report (PAG) for the year 2019-2020 is not available in the UGB. There are sixteen numbers of non teaching staffs including ten numbers of ad-hoc contractual staff are working in the finance department. The Statement of Accounts of the University is completed. The UGB is receiving Non-Plan Non Salary Grant on COSA and Non COSA head for employees including pensioners are receiving regularly from the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of WB. Beside these the UGB is also receiving the Plan-Grant for construction of building at the campus of the University at Malda from the same funding authority. But all other academic and administrative activities are going on from the general fund of the University constituted and collected from various fees from the students and colleges affiliated to the University of Gour Banga. The University has also an endowment fund and some fixed deposit at the branches of PNB and IB situated at Malda.

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1.11 OFFICE OF THE CONTROLLER OF EXAMINATIONS

The University is an academic institution; the primary function of Controller of Examinations Department in a University system is to provide support to the academic activities of the University. The Term-end Examinations of the University is likely to commence from 1st June and 1st December onwards in every year. Online link for submission of the examination form (TEE, & Practical Examinations) by the eligible students for June and December of every year Term-end Examination is also open along with the schedule and necessary instructions/guidelines thereof. The students may submit online examination form accordingly, by the instructions and guidelines provided. And generally the results publication date does not exceed 45 days from the last date of examinations of every Term-end Examinations of the University. 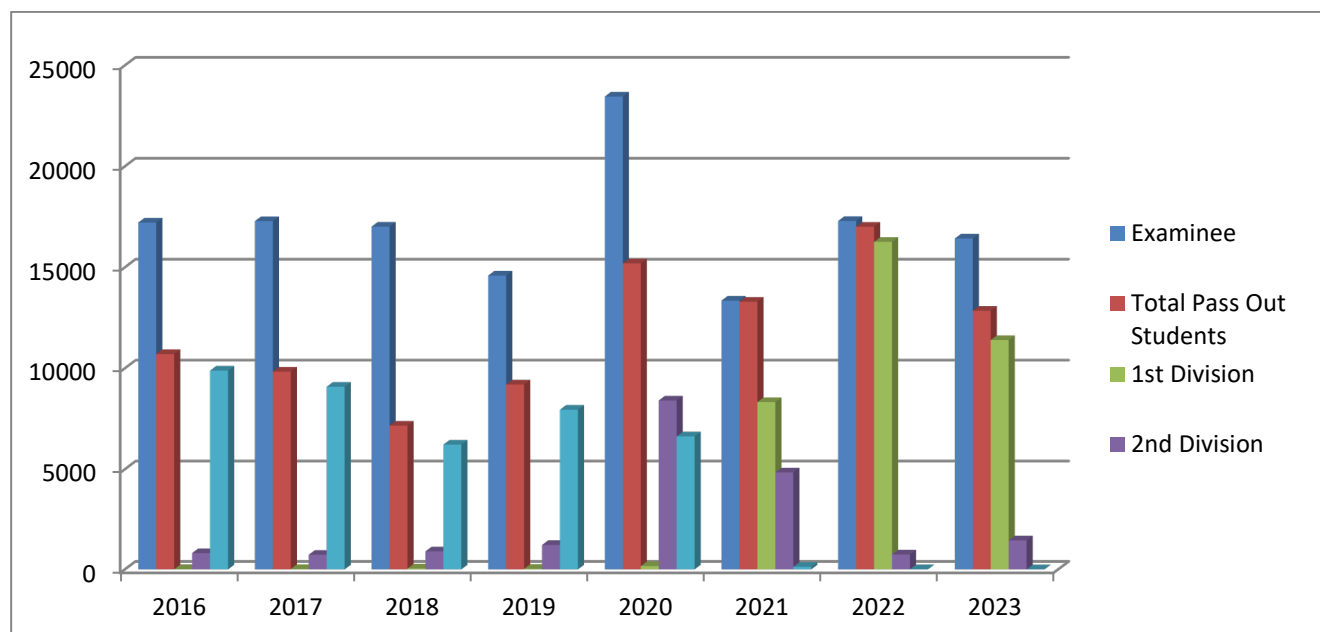

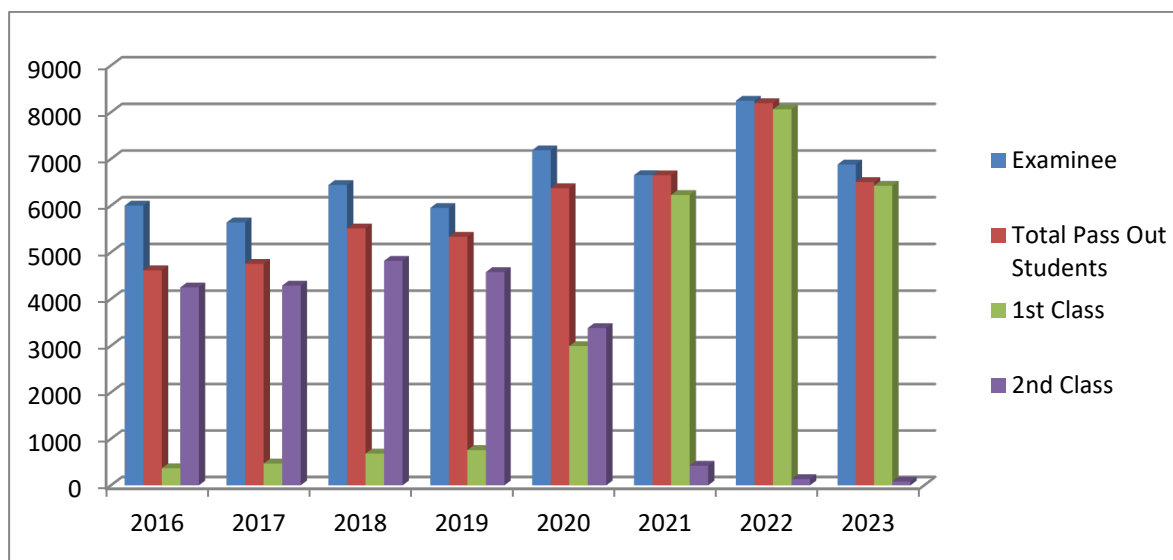

1.15 OFFICE OF THE UNIVERSITY ENGINEER

Highlights of work in the Engineering department:

University of Gour Banga is affiliated under the West Bengal state Act XXVI of 2007 and recognized under section 12B and 2(f) of the UGC Act 1956. At present there are 14 nos. of Ad hoc contractual staff including 3 nos. of Junior Engineers are working in the Engineering department, University of Gour Banga. The total building plan of the University has divided into 2 phases (i.e. Phase-I and phase-II). The vetted estimated cost of the first phase is Rs. 83.81 cr. The first phase is going to be completed very soon with the financial grant received from the department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal from time to time. The Construction agency is Mackintosh Burn Ltd. The agency was engaged with proper procedure after getting approval from the department of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal. The highlights of the work are as follows.

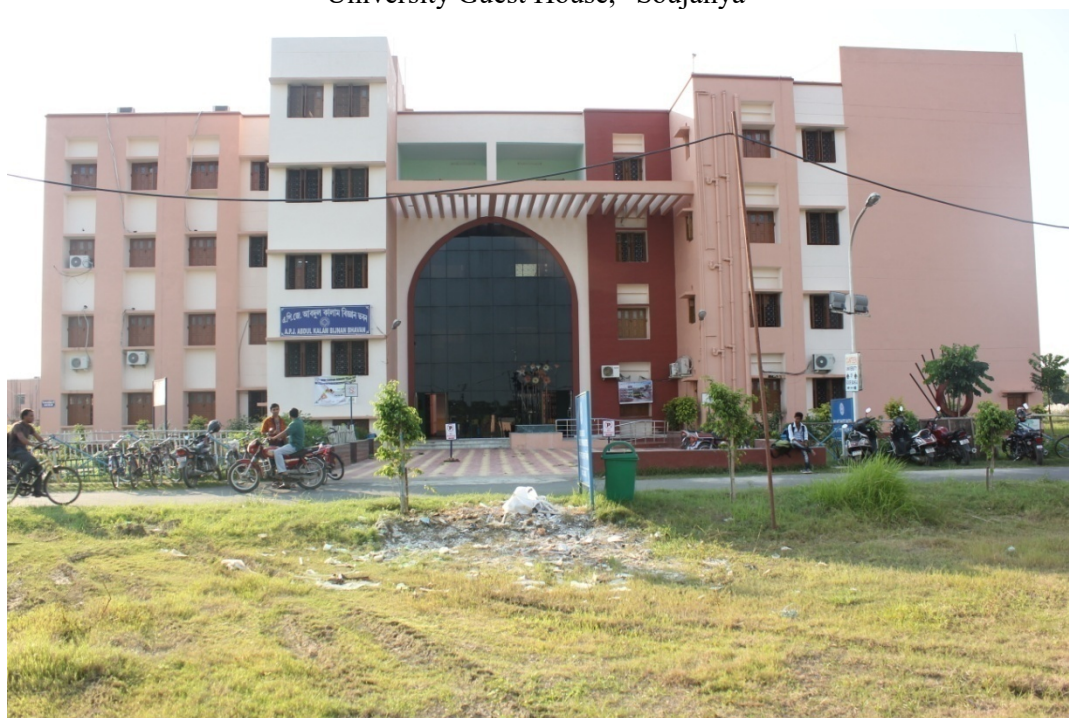

2.2 INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

3.18 PHILOSOPHY DEPARTMENT

The Department of Philosophy of the University of Gour Banga was established in 2012. The first day of starting classes of the department was 19th January, 2012. It was held in two rooms of Satya Chowdhury Stadium, Malda, rented by the university, along with two Assistant Professors: (1) Dr. Sukumar Chandra Roy, (joined on 14.01.2012) and (2) Purbayan Jha, (joined on 16.01.2012) and 70 students. Now the department has five faculty members and intake capacity is 122 per semester. So, the day was historically important for the department. In the next month i.e. in February, 2012, Dr. Ruchira Majumder joined the department as Associate Professor of Philosophy. With these

three faculty members the department started its journey. After 1 semester year, the department had shifted to the main campus of the university in the Dr. A. P. J Abdul Kalam Bijnan Bhavan and finally to Acharya Binoy Kumar Sarkar Kala Bhavan, the Humanities Building of the university at the end of the year 2015. In the meantime, Dr. Jhadeswar Ghosh joined as Associate Professor in September, 2014. The department has also got two more faculty members by the fag end of 2015. Now the total strength of faculty members is five (5). The department offers a syllabus which stimulates the students to think critically on the philosophical problems. The key philosophical areas of study such as epistemology, logic, ethics, metaphysics, philosophy of language are studied both from Indian and Western perspectives, as well as modern Indian thinkers, aesthetics, continental philosophy, philosophy of mind and many more are there in the syllabus with updated developments in those areas. 3.19 PHYSICS DEPARTMENT

The post graduate Department of Physics of the University of Gour Banga started its journey since January, 2012, with three faculty members and twenty students under a two-year-four-semester process.
